- > An EPQ stands for Extended Project Qualification
- > Equivalent to half an A Level
- > Research a topic of your choice before writing an essay about that topic or making an artefact
- Benefits of doing an EPQ are:
  - Universities may reduce their offer if you successfully complete your EPQ
  - You learn a lot of skills that will help with Uni or in employment
  - It gives you a chance to spend time learning about something that really interests you

# Learning Support



Students at the heart of everything we do

Providing personalised support for students with SEND remains a priority in Sixth Form

Sixth Form students can go to ZEN zone anytime if they wish to discuss anything concerning SEND



## Laptop Device Scheme

- > School will provide you with a laptop device for your time here at Colton Hills!
- This is to support you with your studies and ensure that you have everything you need to access the curriculum and to ensure the best usage of your independent study sessions.
- > Needs to be brought with you every day, fully charged!



# What will I get?

You will receive Laptop, charger & original packaging

> These all <u>must</u> be kept, including the packaging!





# How much? Rent or buy?

- > Deposit of £50 will be required to be paid before receiving laptop.
- > At the end of Y13, you will return your laptop and receive your £50 deposit back, providing it is in good condition
- Alternatively, if you wish to purchase the laptop at end of Y13, you will be offered the option at a discounted price, agreed at the time Sixth Form



# Caring for your laptop

- > You are responsible for the care and maintenance of the laptop, including:
  - Protecting the device from damage or loss
  - Repairs must be made by the school, not you or friend!
  - Following the manufacturer's guidelines for use and maintenance



# Report immediately

- If laptop gets damaged, lost or stolen, this must be reported immediately to Mr Bentley, Mr Tamber or Mr Ryan
- > Online safety is extremely important. You are bound to the same Acceptable Use policy for IT equipment at school to ensure appropriate use
- Mr Bentley will carry out spot checks including internet search history to ensure device is used appropriately
